Examples of Body Language Clues

Eyes	Walk
Direct eye contact indicates truth and openness while little or no direct eye contact signals the person is not telling the truth. When someone lies, their eyes glance down or from side to side.	A person can walk beside a companion (equality), or slightly in front (leader), or slightly behind (follower).
Eyes can stare, roll, blink, squeeze, or crinkle. Tears can flow due to stress or grief,	The type of walk can denote the feelings of person. Examples include stroll, amble, march, pace, saunter, skip— they all express different moods.

Hands can be crossed over one's chest, denoting determination or an attempt to warm a cold body.	Women tend to cross their legs at the knee while men will rest their ankle on their knee. A woman who sits like a man will send a different message than one who sits in a more feminine style.
